

TWENTY MINUTES AT A TIME: QUEER-CRIP CHRONOPOLITICS

Since Freeman elaborated the concept of "chrononormativity", queer theory has produced a lively corpus of reflections on how LGBTQ+ people challenge normative experiences of time and offer new perspectives on it. Similarly, the debate around "crip time" shows how disability and illness are both constructed through a specific notion of time and fail to attune to it. Joining these two theoretical frameworks, Mara Pieri will look at the experiences of LGBTQ+ people with chronic illness and the instants in which they deconstruct and redefine time in different configurations. She will advance that the time of queerness and chronic illness pushes us to reimagine the politics of accessibility, our understanding of success and failure, and our queer orientation to happiness.
